Workplan suggests a number of issues that we might prioritise: people on direct payments/self-funders, NHS phase III planning [return to pre-COVID levels of activity in the NHS particularly screening and Out Patients, access to primary care - GP's and practice nurses, dental services, the future of mental health services - service redesign + partnerships with housing, further development of the HOPs project, social media capacity. We will need to be working on: follow up from 'A good send-off', developing a media library and building social media capacity, Mental Health Sector Connector, NHS and social care impact on Health Inequalities. 	

		 High priority issues for the staff team: To be more topical and relevant we need to be more visible in the media and on social media, the basic requirement for that is people coming forward to tell their personal stories and being prepared to be recorded and interviewed, Board assistance with that would be helpful
