You will be fully supported and briefed by the Healthwatch team.

Main Duties

- Attend specific meetings as a representative of Healthwatch Brighton and Hove
- Prepare for each meeting by reading all relevant paperwork
- When required, speak on behalf of Healthwatch Brighton and Hove
- Report back within seven days of each meeting using our feedback form
- Report urgent issues to us as soon as possible after the meeting
- Liaise with our staff team prior to meetings to ascertain key issues and information

You should have experience of:

- Speaking at meetings / public events
- Representing the views of others objectively
- Listening to and giving consideration to the views of others.

You should also be able to:

- Read and digest written materials
- Leave aside one's own personal agenda
