Hospital discharge well- being project (HOPS)	Proactive wellbeing calls to people discharged from BSUH hospitals to home on care pathways 0 and 1. To provide support for recently discharged people by signposting to relevant services. Interim reports produced, quarterly. Started March 2020 and is ongoing until March 2021. Follow-up phone calls planned.  Funding from B&H City Council secure at £13,000 a year. NHS Funding at £33,000 per year uncertain after June 2022. Clarification is being sought. COVID-19 updates	Regular updates have now been largely incorporated into the HW monthly newsletter. Ad hoc bulletins are issued as required to reflect changes, urgent updates and information about the COVID-19 vaccination and booster roll -out.  Specific reports previously delivered:  1. The impact of COVID-19 on Brighton and Hove: a statistical evaluation (July 2020).  2. The role and impact of Healthwatch Brighton and Hove during the coronavirus pandemic: three activity reports published covering January to April 2020; May to June 2020 and July 2020 to February 2021. Mental Health Sector Connector	Sector connector is a way for non-NHS organisations (the Sector) to engage and influence the Sussex Health and Care Partnership Mental Health Programme. The Sector Connector project has been developed over the last year by voluntary and community sector organisations across Sussex. Healthwatch in Sussex have agreed to coordinate, convene, and enable the project. The Project has been developed through the SHCP Mental Health Programme Board and it is within that governance structure that the Forums will exist and report.  Only 2 from 4 forums delivered in 2021/22, as NHS was in business continuity. Catch up required for 2022/23  SRO - David Project Coordinator - David / Michelle	Ongoing - most recent meeting December 3 <sup>rd</sup> 2020. Next one being planned for May / June  £6,000 a year funding from NHS. To be renegotiate for 2022/23
Digital exclusion Engagement / Roar	An engagement project working in collaboration with a GP practice in Whitehawk and East Brighton PCN. Includes survey data and interviews. Sussex-wide application to be reviewed.	Ongoing. £10,000 NHS funding Received 2021/22. Similar available for 2022/23

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Patient transport Services	The CCG commissioned HW to conduct a series of reviews and data collection to inform the recommissioning and service specification for the patient transport services (PTS) across Sussex. A literature review, final report and public facing report were all delivered in Jan 2021 (together with a press release). Follow-up meetings have been held with CCG and SCAS. A revised timeline for the new contract means that procurement is now in 2022, with contract starting 2023.  Since the reports, HW is now working closely with current provider of PTS, SCAS. They presented at our June HW Board meeting (HW in Sx attended) and fed back on our findings and recommendations. We helped SCAS deliver a patient forum in Oct 2021 and are supporting a further one for bariatric patients in the new year.  A HW one-year on report was published in October 2021: "Patient Transport Services - how your views are helping to reshape services". This describes how our findings fed into a national NHS review of PTS (their report published Sept 2021), and other impacts such as our closer working with SCAS. The NHS review has delayed recommissioning of the Sussex-wide PTS due to plans to issue a model service spec and standardised eligibility criteria for all PTS services.  We are now (winter 2021/22) supporting the CCG via our HOPS questionnaire to gather more info on patients who've experienced problems with PTS journeys as part of their unplanned discharge. Follow-up activities ongoing:  - One year on report published Oct 2021 - SCAS/HW/ CCG patient forums - CCG meetings  NHS funding received 2021/22. Legacy work as yet Unfunded. End of life	End of Life report on LGBTQ+ - following Fran's one-year on report, HW were contacted by UHS's LGBT network lead. We met with reps 16/6 and took a joint proposal to UHS's PEEG 21/6 where we secured support for a further project. HW has conducted a review of existing EoL LGBTQ specific guidance and produced a draft report with recs. We met with the Trust in Nov who welcomed the report and agreed to conduct further internal research with outcomes to be presented at April PEEG. Our report is seen as catalyst for wider change on inclusion and will be shared with EoL Steering Grp, Mortality Brd and non-exec directors. Further impact to be monitored in conjunction with UHS. Nov 21: awaiting input on draft recs from Trust before publishing report  End of Life Webinar involving Marian Messih and CCG. Write-up and taking the work forward started in the EoL Reports (below). Community Diagnostic Hubs (CDH)	In April 2021, HW were alerted to upcoming NHSE/I national guidance around CDHs. Subsequent contact led to a rapid 3-week project, with HW engaging with marginalised groups and case study collation around diagnostic journeys (LGBT, BAME, complex needs, young people). Report completed late April and shared with NHSE/I who have used it to inform national guidance to be issued later this year. HW now in contact with CCG leads and we have shared report ("gold dust"). Report published with NHSE/I & CCG response in June. Report shared with CCG, & Trust who have welcomed it. HW has now agreed with CCG to continue working with them to deliver co-design of CDH.  Last CCG meeting held in Sept. Stage one for CDHs started in Oct ('rebadge' and additional capacity at existing sites), Stage two is planned for Dec (marks start of 'one stop shop' model but full model roll out has a 2-5 year plan). Meeting with CCG again in November.  Findings relate to other projects: Outpatients' Transformation/booking hub, MSK, Planned Care and patient communications. MSK services	Healthwatch West Sussex leading on this.  In September 2021, HW began working with CCG on MSK services. Existing contracts are due to be renewed in 2023 Sussex-wide so this marked an opportunity for HW to influence the recommissioning process. HW has attended a series of planned workshops Sept- Dec, feeding into design proposals and flagging patient concerns/considerations.  We have used results from our outpatient's referral survey (see above) and CDHs to feed into this work. Healthwatch meeting with RA and NL Practice manager has lead to a survey covering patient feedback of service with new opening hours. May lead to survey or further patient engagement around feedback on merger and eventual loss of local surgery. Dental	Dental queries are the second biggest reason why people contact HW (since December 2020). Using this fact we have:  Completed a dental survey of 56 people during the pandemic.  Reviewed OOH services (webpages and phone messages) of 43 dental practices in B&H and produced a report "Accessing dental services under COVID-19" published 29.3.21. A press release was picked up by local press.  In June, we raised concerns affecting migrants and refugees which generated a response for NHSE commissioner. We are also continuing to signpost and support the public.  Working as Healthwatch in Sussex we produced a detailed patient guidance, working also with LDC, Foundation dentist and others. This was published in Sept, and reproduced by other HW teams.  Nov: we completed a ring round of all practices discovering that none were offering NHS treatment to new patients.
